






















MESSAGE FROM FOUNDATION Vice President

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

NIC U CELEBRATE & DEDICATE

onmouth Medical Center celebrated its expansion with a dedication ceremony renaming the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit as the Hirair and Anna Hovnanian Foundation Regional Newborn Center at the Monmouth Medical Center's Unterberg Children's Hospital after receiving their \$2 million gift. With eight new intensive-care bassinets, the neonatal unit can now accommodate 31 babies at a time in a clean, welcoming and state-of-the-art facility. The expansion adds three new lactation rooms for nursing mothers, increasing the unit's total to four, additional equipment and storage spaces, and a new parent sleep room for families to catch up on their rest.

As the first level III Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) in New Jersey and one of the nation's best in terms of outcomes, the NICU provides specialized care for more than 500 babies annually – even those weighing less than a pound and born at just 24 weeks' gestation.

The miracles accomplished by the doctors at Monmouth's Regional Newborn Center astound me. I just want to do my part to help them care for more infants.

Grateful Patient... DAWKINS

udi and Pete Dawkins love Monmouth Medical Center for different reasons and from different perspectives. Pete Dawkins, M.P.A., Ph. D., is a classic over-achiever. He's a Heisman Trophy winner, Rhodes Scholar, retired Brigadier General, US Army, Vietnam War hero, financial services executive and US Senate candidate. He's alive, today, thanks to two life-saving surgeries he received at Monmouth

In 2008, Pete began noticing a variety of odd and seemingly unrelated symptoms. One morning, he decided to email his long-time physician, Dr. Eric Burkett, about his symptoms. As soon as Dr. Burkett saw his email he called and insisted that Judi immediately drive Pete to the emergency room. He met them there, listened to Pete's now slurred speech, and realized that he was having TIAs (Transient Ischemic Attack), also know as ministrokes. He quickly assembled a top-notch team - Dr. Neil Holland, Chief of Neurology and Medical Director of the Neuroscience Institute at Monmouth Medical Center, and Dr. George Constantinopoulos, Division Chairman, Vascular Surgery, at Monmouth Medical Center – who worked together to decide the best course of emergency treatment. Surgery on his carotid artery was a complete success, with the effects of the TIA's eventually reversed.

Pete returned to his active lifestyle until 2010, when his yearly physical caught something that Pete hadn't yet noticed. Although he was planning on leaving for vacation the next morning, Pete instead found himself back at MMC with an almost complete blockage of his other carotid artery. The same team gathered again, and performed a second successful, life-saving surgery.

These days Pete lives with his arteriosclerosis (a stiffening or hardening of the arterial walls), but it is kept under control with medication. He feels great, and reports that his scars are nearly invisible.

His wife, Judi, a former board chair of the Foundation Board of Trustees, has served since 1997 and has been a member of the Monmouth Medical Center Board of Trustees since 2003. She knows first-hand of the exceptional care provided at the Medical Center. Judi could never have imagined when joining the Board how much she would come to rely on that quality of care for her own family.

Our family is dedicated to supporting MMC for the extraordinary care provided to every patient.

In 2011, Judi and Pete's daughter, Noël, was diagnosed with Lyme disease, but wasn't responding to treatment. When her condition suddenly and dangerously deteriorated, Dr. Frank Vozos, President and Chief Executive Officer at Monmouth Medical Center, stepped in to link the Dawkins' up with the renowned cardiac team at Newark Beth Israel Medical Center, a Barnabas Health affiliate and close working partner of our interdisciplinary teams. It was quickly discovered that Noël was suffering from a life-threatening infection of her mitral valve. She had open heart surgery five days later. Today, Noël is back running a business in New York City, and being a hands-on mother to three young children.

Judi and Pete remain committed to Monmouth Medical Center for so many reasons: the extraordinary care provided to every patient, leadership in cancer care, sustained growth in maternity services, continued growth in the Unterberg Children's Hospital at MMC, and so much more. It's an exciting time at Monmouth Medical Center. The Dawkins will be the recipients of the Community Leadership Award that will be presented at the annual Crystal Ball on May 10, 2014. Pete and Judi Dawkins are eternally grateful and thankful to be a part of it! ■
